

What a Book!

- Bible comes from the Greek biblios, which means book
- · Scripture, which means writings
- Contains the words that <u>God</u> spoke, so is also called <u>God's</u> <u>Word</u>

God's Words

- 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - All Scripture is <u>inspired</u>, which means "<u>God-breathed</u>"
- · 2 Peter 1:16-21
 - God inspired men through the Holy Spirit

Inspiration

 God empowered men through the Holy Spirit to speak and write His truth

God Guided the Bible's Human Authors

- Several dozen people
- Some unknown
 - Author of <u>Job</u>—around <u>1400</u> B.C.
 - Author of Hebrews—around A.D. 100

One Story from God

- Exodus 34:27
 - God told Moses what to write
- 1 Corinthians 2:10-13
 - God's Spirit taught people

God Communicated His Word to People

- Two ways people communicate
 - Words
 - Actions

God Communicated His Word to People (cont.)

- Two ways God communicated
 - God's words are summarized in the Bible
 - God's <u>actions</u> are summarized in <u>Jesus</u>
 <u>Christ</u>

- Minor Prophets—Hosea to Malachi
 - Twelve prophets during time of Israel's kings

Prophet

 God's spokesman; one who speaks to others for God

Prophecy

 Words spoken by God through people; may include prediction of future events



Genesis: Beginnings

- Beginning of <u>Earth</u>
- Beginning of man and woman
- Beginning of sin in the world
- Beginning of <u>redemption</u> and <u>salvation</u>

Genesis: Beginnings (cont.)

- Beginning of <u>family life</u>
- Beginning of <u>civilization</u>, <u>cities</u>, and <u>skills</u>
- Beginning of <u>nations</u>
- Beginning of the **Hebrew** race

The Author

- God prepared <u>Moses</u>
 - Trained in the palace of <u>Pharaoh</u> of <u>Egypt</u>

God's Commands to Adam and Eve

- 1. Multiply and fill the earth
- 2. Subdue the earth; rule over the animals and plants
- 3. Do not eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil

Consequences of the Fall

- Knowledge of good and evil
- Fear of God; separation
- Antagonism; they blamed others
- Enmity with the serpent and his offspring

Consequences of the Fall (cont.)

- Increased pain in childbirth
- Disruption within marriage
- · Difficulty in caring for the earth
- Death

God's Plan of Redemption (Gen. 3:15)

- The serpent represents <u>Satan</u>
- The person who will crush Satan—<u>Christ</u>
- Satan bruises Christ's heel by condemning Him to death

God's Plan of Redemption (cont.)

- Christ bruises Satan's head by . . .
 - Saving sinners through His death and resurrection
 - His defeating and judging Satan in the future

The Flood (Gen. 6:1-9)

- Noah's sons
 - Ham, Shem, and Japheth
- God decided to destroy earth for mankind's <u>evil</u>
- God felt grieved for creating mankind, because the earth was full of violence

The Flood (cont.)

- Noah was <u>righteous/just</u>
- Noah walked with God

Noah's Responsibilities

6:17 to send a flood

6:14-16 to build an ark according to God's plan

God's Promises

Noah's Responsibilities

6:18 to spare Noah's family

6:19-21 to gather animals on the ark

God's Promises

Noah's Responsibilities

8:21–22 Never to curse the earth or destroy all creatures again

8:20 to honor God with sacrifices

God's Promises

Noah's Responsibilities

9:2-3 to make man caretaker of the earth

9:1, 7 to multiply and fill the earth

God's Promises

Noah's Responsibilities

9:9-11 never to send another world-wide flood

9:4 not to eat bloody meat

God's Promises

Noah's Responsibilities

9:12–17 to set a rainbow in the sky to remind men of His promise

9:5-6 not to kill people
